

The Coming of the Son of Man

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The Way of the Most High

“Exalting belief in our Father, the Most High יהוה (YaHUAH), through His Turah, the 5 scrolls of M'shih (Moses).”

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This is a very short and sweet article. Or perhaps bitter, depending on your perspective in dealing with the reality of this subject. Originally this was given as a challenge to Donald Scoggins, a popular Messianic teacher on Facebook. He never did reply. This goes out now as a general challenge to any New Testament believer. It all started when the followers of the blasphemer (Yeshua/Jesus) asked if he was "the Christ (anointed - meshiyakh - messiah), the son of God" (Matt. 26:63-64, common KJV). He answered them and said "thou hast said." In this first part of his answer, the blasphemer does not deny the claim, that he is the anointed one, the son of the Most High. So my challenge is this. Where in the Scriptures did it ever say that the anointed one (meshiyakh) would be the "son of YaH" or "son of Al" (the Mighty One)? More importantly, and evidently more problematic for New Testament believers, is the fact that he continued his answer in saying "Playn" - Greek for "moreover/furthermore." Now pay attention folks. He said, furthermore, in other words - now here is some proof. And what proof did he offer? He said - "you will see the son of Adam (anthropos) seated on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven." Now this is often found in the New Testament, that the blasphemer refers to the Father as greater than he and all sorts of similar statements. In this case, he refers to the Father as "power." Fine, but the blasphemer is seated at the right hand of the Father and coming on the clouds? Well last I checked, YaH did not share His power with anyone else (Sh'moot (Ex.) 8:10). New Testament believers ask people like us to accept the blasphemer as "Messiah" when the proof he offered never came to pass. In other words, if he said he is "Messiah" based on the fact that he is coming on the clouds at the right hand of the Father, we should not accept him until it comes to pass. For YaH said that a true prophet's words must be verified by its fulfillment.
